**When the Siren Blows:
GO IN and TUNE IN!**

The City of Laramie's Outdoor Warning Siren system consists of six sirens placed strategically throughout the City. The Outdoor Warning Sirens are controlled from the 911 Dispatch Center.

The Outdoor Warning Siren system makes use of a tone to alert residents to the imminent approach of severe weather and other emergencies that require immediate notification. This system is a part of an emergency network designed to provide for the safety of our citizens. All local radio stations and cable television interrupt, will be activated in case of an emergency.

What do I do when I hear the warning sirens?

- ♣ Remain calm and **go inside and seek shelter immediately**; turn on a radio or television and listen carefully to instructions.
- ♣ Tune in to any local radio station or your cable TV for official information from the Laramie Communications Department.
- ♣ Take the necessary actions to provide yourself and your family, and stay indoors until the danger has passed.
- ♣ Please do not call 911 or Laramie Fire Department for information unless you are reporting a life-threatening situation or hazardous condition.

There are 6 sirens located throughout the City:

- Spring Creek Elementary (12th & Russell)
- Albany County Fairgrounds (Hwy 287 South)
- City Shops (4th and Sully)
- Linford Elementary School (120 Johnson, West Laramie)
- Oriole Lane (Grand Ave & I-80)
- National Guard Armory (30th St & Armory Rd)
